# Sunday School - Preschool-5th Grade

For example, we'll begin by reinforcing the concept: "You belong to God and He will save you in times of trouble" with Moses, the Plagues and the Red Sea. In the Bible Drama room, kids will reenact God's rescuing His people through the Red Sea; in Bible Crafts they'll create a parting of the Red Sea; in Bible Games, they'll play games to understand the plagues, and in the Interactive Bible room, they'll see a short summary video of the Bible passage and then complete a project to realize that each plague defeated a certain Egyptian false god and therefore, God is our all-

powerful and only Savior.
